UNIVERSITY OF MISSOURI GRADUATE PROFESSIONAL COUNCIL LEADS GradsHaveDebt2 NATIONAL CALL-CONGRESS DAY

[Columbia, Missouri] –The University of Missouri Graduate Professional Council (GPC) will host a National Call-Congress Day event on Wednesday, November 18, 2015 in Traditions Lounge of the MU Student Center (2nd floor) between 10am-4pm. As part of the national GradsHaveDebt2 campaign, graduate and professional students at the University of Missouri will join fellow students around the nation to call federal lawmakers about their overwhelming student loan debt, the interest rate inequality facing graduate and professional students, and to urge legislators to stop profiting off students.

GPC and the National Association of Graduate-Professional Students (NAGPS) launched the campaign in 2013 in response to legislation that increased the financial burdens on students pursuing postbaccalaureate degrees. This campaign continues as a series of local, regional, and national events. Over the past few years, students across the country have made over 2,500 phone calls and contacted more than half of Congress, urging legislators to act on postgraduate student loan inequalities.

GradsHaveDebt2 is one of GPC's most notable successes. The campaign gives post-baccalaureate students a voice in the student loan conversation by educating legislators and the public about postgraduate student debt, interest rate inequalities, and the billions of dollars the government profits off students.

National Call-Congress Day will allow graduate and professional students at the University of Missouri to express concerns, share stories of personal impact, and urge Congressional action on student loan inequality. The campaign works to motivate members of Congress to:

Stop the government form profiting off students, **Reunify** the undergraduate and graduate student loan interest rates, and **Reinstate** the in-school interest subsidy for graduate-professional students.
