WHEREAS,	The Graduate Professional Council has previously voted to amend the internal mechanisms of the General Assembly regarding both the definition of a Represented Area and the minimum level of satisfactory attendance during the regularly-scheduled monthly meetings; and			
WHEREAS,	The point of these Resolutions was partly to bring clarity to a historically unclear process			
	for joining the General Assembly of the Graduate Professional Council; and			
WHEREAS,	There still seems to be some confusion regarding what the previous changes mean for			
	Represented Areas and their Representatives for the forthcoming academic year; and			
WHEREAS,	Specific details of these changes can be located in Resolution 1819-03 and Resolution			
DECOLVED	1819-09; therefore be it			
RESOLVED,	By majority vote of the General Assembly here gathered that the Graduate Professional Council does pass this Resolution and its attached Appendix to remind the current			
	members of the General Assembly and clarify for new members of the General Assembly			
	some of the important changes to the membership criteria for Representatives of the			
	General Assembly for the 2019-2020 academic year and each Represented Area's			
	minimum standard of meeting attendance for the purposes of achieving "Good Standing"; and be it further			
RESOLVED,	That the Appendix to this Resolution contains the relevant information regarding (1) the list of Represented Areas of the General Assembly recognized for the 2019-2020 academic year, (2) the number of Representatives allowed for each of those recognized			
	Represented Areas, and (3) the minimum number of meeting credits that must be earned			
	by that Represented Area's Representatives together; and be it further			
RESOLVED,	That the number of Representatives allowed for each Represented Area for the upcoming			
	academic year is determined by that Area's total enrollment of graduate and/or			
	professional students for the current academic year, including online and distance			
	students; and be it further			
RESOLVED,	That the number of Representatives allowed for each Represented Area represents the			
	maximum possible number of votes and speaking privileges that Represented Area may			
DEGOL IVES	have at any one meeting of the General Assembly; and be it further			
RESOLVED,	That, if a Represented Area has more than one Representative, that Represented Area need not send all of its Representatives to any specific meeting of the General Assembly,			

**RESOLVED,** That it is the responsibility of all Representatives of a given Represented Area to jointly earn for their Area a minimum number of Meeting Credits in order to achieve "Good

Standing" for their Area, where the satisfactory minimum is determined by considering that Area's maximum possible meeting credits, as determined by their number of Representatives and the typical number of meetings of the General Assembly for a given semester; and be it further

- **RESOLVED,** That these changes to how meeting credits are earned allows a Represented Area to be flexible with when they earn their meeting credits across a semester; and be it further
- **RESOLVED,** That a Represented Area may petition the Executive Board to change the standard of evaluation which determines their minimum level of acceptable meeting credits for any given semester; and be it further
- **RESOLVED,** This petition may be sent to the Executive Board either before or after a semester ends and the evaluations of "Good Standing" are settled for the academic semester; and be it further
- **RESOLVED,** That petitions must be emailed to either the President at gpcpresident@missouri.edu or the general resources account at gpc@missouri.edu; and be it further resolved
- **RESOLVED,** That decisions regarding petitions may be appealed to the advisor of the Graduate Professional Council; and be it further
- **RESOLVED,** That the Representatives of the General Assembly bring a copy of this Resolution to their Represented Area so as to inform each student in their Represented Area of the aforementioned changes made by passing Resolution 1819-03 and Resolution 1819-09, and to make them aware of the powers and responsibilities afforded by those Resolutions; and be it further
- **RESOLVED,** That each academic year the Executive Board submits a Resolution to ratify the membership and minimum standard of meeting attendance for the purposes of achieving "Good Standing" for the forthcoming academic year.
