    - Add additional detail to second clause of resolution
    - In the second Whereas clause, STRIKE all that follows "removing" and REPLACE with "removing a statue of President Thomas Jefferson, located in the Francis Quadrangle and donated in 2001, from the campus; and"
    - Tori and Jesse accepted
  - Tori makes additional friendly edit in third to last clause

    - "Specific antiracist goals" resolution
    - Way to ask students to include antiracist policies in syllabi?

- Tori: Encouraging language to be included in all syllabi?
- Cheyenne: Encourage university staff to include antiracist policies in our syllabi in GPC
- Tori: Current resolution not exhaustive
  - Working to creating our own goals list
  - o Don't want to limit ourselves to specifics with this document
- Bryan: Way to collect ideas for implementation?
  - Tori: Yes, survey via social media
- Cheyenne: Can share additional info with Tori
  - Tori enthusiastically accepts
- Blake
  - Antiracist training at organizational level
  - Shannon: Please share resources, whoever may have something to share
- Jason E.
  - Proposing more clarity
  - Monuments, plaques, etc. More inclusive to clarify intent
  - Jesse added
  - Shannon seconded
  - Discussion on amendment
  - o None
  - Objection?
    - o None

  - Back to Cheyenne about syllabi
  - Be careful what we require with specific membership
  - May differ from department
  - Cheyenne: That's exactly it
    - Why would each department be against it?
  - Nicole: Not that necessarily, but just want to be clear about it

  - Friendly in Blake's amendment
  - Add "and participating in"

- Involves university-level measure
- Just point of information
- Cheyenne: We need to have uncomfortable conversations
  - Highly recommend we put it in place
  - For antiracist policy
- Discussion
  - o None
- Vote on resolution
  - 51% approval
    - Resolution passes
    - Tori will be charged with distribution to appropriate parties
- COVID-19
  - o Molly offers recap on town hall with Dr. Hart and Dr. Stackman
  - Show Me Renewal should be ready by this Friday
  - Want to be everyone is receiving necessary information
    - Graduate student orientation and training expectations to be shared for instructional roles (how to resolve conflicts, etc.)
    - Ryleigh offered asynchronous (mandatory) online training
      - Up to departments to also implement orientation
  - All classroom instructors are to have online contingency plan ready (just in case)
  - $\circ$   $\$  Face shields and masks will be made available to students and instructors
    - University procuring them from unknown entity
    - Instructors should be supplied with kits for classrooms
  - o Flexible attendance
  - Trying to get community support with public health recommendation adherence
  - Things are very much in flux
  - Ryleigh: GPC will be tailoring our virtual meetings
    - Unsure if we're going to have in-person meetings
    - We will be making accommodations
    - Accessibility within classrooms can we have classes have outside?
      - Strongly suggest we don't due to accessibility issues
      - Encourage recording of classroom discussions no matter what
    - We will be providing information about rights as student
      - No requirement for full disclosure, simply state that you can't attend
  - Jesse: We no longer have auditorium space
    - Meetings will likely be digital
    - Will be discussed
  - o Jesse: GPC drafting best practices digital guide for future meetings
  - $\circ$   $\;$  Ryleigh: As per resolution, will be creating IDE statement for GPC and GA  $\;$ 
    - Would love to open that up to all individuals
    - Please reach out to us if you have any feedback
  - Molly: Response to Laura
    - The provost does send out weekly message about classroom expectations

- All messages are available on provost website
- Dr. Hart tries to pull and share relevant info with grad students
- If you don't "Show Me Renewal" message by next Friday, then reach out to Dr. Hart
- Ongoing professional development opportunities to help instructors adjust teaching as needed
- Molly: Not a recording of today's town hall
  - Molly will share copious notes
  - Ryleigh: Need to figure out legal side of recording meetings
- Nicole: Currently enrolled in online teaching preparation course
  - Online teaching certification
  - Something beneficial to think about Summer courses
  - Jesse: Could you send that link information to Bryan?
  - Nicole: Yes

## Open Forum

- Colleen: Attended town hall
  - Biggest frustration is that GPC is supposed to be our advocate, help convey information
  - What is GPC planning on doing to advocate concerns and convey information?
    - Tori: Totally makes sense
      - Serving on numerous committees, gathering information, representing grad interests
      - Dr. Hart implementing plan in her office to best assist in the classroom setting
      - Happy to convey concerns and questions to administrators in committee meetings
      - Things are very much in flux
        - Note all info is subject to change
    - Colleen: How communication is being conveyed moving forward?
      - Tori: Info constantly changing
        - If there's issue we have in Show Me Renewal plan, we can follow up and address
    - Colleen: Would rather have info early on (and in flux) than nothing
      - Tori: Hard to get feedback on information that isn't consistent
      - We do not have student sitting on academic committee
      - We bring any concerns students have moving forward
    - Shannon: Apology on behalf of GPC
      - Finally able to pull from "Show Me Renewal" plan
      - Create something related to student rights
      - Social media campaign with other student groups
        - Not doing this alone, working with other organizations
  - o Al: Video campaign
    - Beginning of July, series of related videos from different student leaders
    - Want to address questions from students

- Ability to spread awareness
- Johanna: April / May two grad students were called the n-word students rights to know about acts of racial slurs – not feeling comfortable at Mizzou's campus during upcoming election – being clear about what are the consequences for incidents of racial slurs, etc.
  - Tori: LBC mentioned similar incidents
    - Didn't feel that they received proper attention
      - Even from Title IX
    - Met with LBC and MSA president and discuss remedies
    - Going to meet with President Choi
      - If no serious response, going to issue demands
  - Johanna: GPC has power to address these issues
    - Important point of advocacy
