Established in 1994 by the Graduate Professional Council (GPC), the Rollins Society recognizes graduate and professional students who have significantly advanced the well-being of self-defined communities beyond the scope of their academic work. During Mizzou Tap Day, the Society honors a select group of graduate and professional students whose commitment to service reflects its watchwords: **Officium (Duty)**, **Fides (Faithfulness)**, and **Ductus (Leadership)**.

Selections are based primarily on the **quality** of the nominee's service rather than the **quantity** of contributions or communities served.

Mizzou Tap Day (Tentative: April)

For more than sixty years, Mizzou has hosted the annual Tap Day ceremony to recognize new initiates of several campus honor societies. Membership in these groups is open to upper-class and graduate students across all academic units.

Named for the tradition of "tapping" new members, Tap Day—held in Jesse Auditorium—celebrates exemplary academic, leadership, and service achievements. Honorary groups also "honor tap" a faculty, staff, or community member who has significantly contributed to the student experience.

Initiates' identities remain confidential until the ceremony, during which a current member or designee "taps" each new inductee. The ceremony concludes with the singing of the Alma Mater, *Old Missouri*.

Criteria for Nomination

- Must be enrolled at the University of Missouri-Columbia as a graduate or professional student.
- Must be in good standing (as defined by each department/college/school).
- Must be nominated by another person associated with Mizzou or Rollins Society.

Submission Requirements

All required materials must be submitted as **one combined PDF**, saved as: **Last Name_First Name_RollinsApplication2026**, and emailed to **rollinssociety@missouri.edu**. Incomplete submissions will not be accepted.

Personal statement written by the nominee describing the areas, groups or defined communities they
have served.
Nominee's CV or resume
Nominating letter (maximum 2 pages) from the chief nominator, addressing their relationship to the
nominee, the name and purpose of the self-defined community (with any abbreviation or nickname), and
personal observations of the nominee's contributions.
Three additional recommendation letters (maximum 1 page each) from others acquainted with the
nominee's service record (e.g., supervisors, faculty/staff, community leaders, peers).
